

Weak Query Letter Example:

Subject: My Script

Hello,

My name is John, and I wrote a script. It's about love, loss, and finding yourself. I think it would make a great movie, and I'd love to know what you think. Please let me know if you'd like to read it.

Why this doesn't work:

- No personalization (feels like a mass email).
- No title, genre, or page count.
- The description is vague and generic.
- The tone is casual instead of professional.

Strong Query Letter Example:

Subject: Thriller: Driftwood

Hi [Producer's Name],

I admired your company's recent release *The Invitation* and thought my contained survival thriller, *Driftwood*, a 104-page feature script, might align with your slate.

Logline: *When a young woman's kayak capsizes off the Alaskan coast, she must outwit both the freezing wilderness and a mysterious figure who seems determined to keep her from reaching land alive.*

My work has placed in the Nicholl Fellowship top 15% and the Austin Film Festival Second Round. I've also had short fiction published in *Dark Matter Magazine*.

I'd love to send you the full script if it sounds like a fit. Thank you for your time and consideration.

- Logline conveys genre + conflict + hook.
- Short, credible bio.
